



The meeting adjourned at 8:50 PM.



Museum of Modern Art (MoMA) Features 1963 Jaguar XK-E

The Museum of Modern Art (MoMA) is recognized worldwide as "the arbiter of good design." The judgment of MoMA, together with generations of sports car aficionados have confirmed: "The Jaguar E-type is a work of art!"

Unveiled at the Geneva Auto Show in 1961, the E-type --better known as the XK-E in the U.S.-- was designed by Malcolm Sayer, a Jaguar stylist since 1950. Sayer was trained in aerodynamics and aircraft design and had designed the C-type and D-

> type cars which dominated the prestigious Le Mans races in the 1950s. Jaguar founder and president Sir William Lyons, however, maintained the title of Chief Stylist to assure himself final authority on all designs.

Introduced to the U.S. at the April 1961 New York Auto Show, the XK-E caused an immediate sensation: "The Most Exciting Sports Car News of 1961," Car and Driver reported. "Jaguar Adds a Minor Miracle by Selling Such A Machine At An Incredible Price!" (The first XK-E roadsters cost approximately \$5,500 in 1961, about half the price of Ferrari, Mercedes or Aston Martin). Road and Track added: "The Car Comes Up to And Exceeds All Our Expectations!"

With a top speed of 149.1 mph, 0-60 in just 7.9 seconds, 0-100 in a quick 15.9 seconds and a price of just \$5,500 in 1961 –all in a comfortable, drop-dead-gorgeous, easy-to-drive grand touring racer-- who could ask for anything more? On its release, Enzo Ferrari called it "The most beautiful car ever made."







In 1964, the Museum of Modern Art placed two scale models of the original E-type coupe in its permanent collection. In 1995, MoMA decided to add a third car to its prestigious design collection. At the top of their 10-12 car wish-list was the XK-E Series I. To find a car of museum quality, MoMA received help from Jaguar of North America and Jaguar Clubs of North America (JCNA). Jim Kuhlmann, founding member and oft president of Jaguar Club of Florida (JCOF), publicized the search. A number of submissions throughout North America were considered, but when MoMA representatives flew to Tallahassee, FL, their search ended quite quickly. They found JCOF member Jerry Wise willing to part with his exquisite 1963 opalescent dark blue roadster.

Jaguar Cars President of North American Operations, Michael H Dale, and Mark S Miller, Vice President of Public Affairs, arranged the purchase and donation to MoMA on behalf of Jaguar founder Sir William Lyons, E-Type designer Malcolm Sayer and chief engineer at the time, William M. Heynes.







It should go without saying that the value of the beautifully preserved 1963 roadster had increased many, many times from 1963 to 1995. Even so, the price back then is only a fraction of the estimated value of this XK-E today. As you may have guessed, it is not for sale at any price.

MoMA's "Refining the Sports Car: Jaguar's E-Type" exhibit opened on April 4 and continued through August 20, 1996. You can view an excellent informative video presentation by MoMA at: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=k2t3foKLjTU

Now, 20 years after its first exhibit at MoMa, this 1963 XK-E roadster will again be featured in a special display entitled "From the Collection: The 1960s."

The Museum of Modern Art will reinstall its fourth floor collection galleries with works exclusively from the 1960s. This installation interweaves works from MoMA's six curatorial departments in a presentation that highlights the decade's broad ranging experimentation and the interdisciplinary nature of its artistic production. The galleries will proceed chronologically with work across disciplines installed year by year.

This exhibit should be a "must see" for those who [mis]spent youth in the '60s and grew up to enjoy Jaguar cars. As many of us know, "If you remember the '60s, you weren't really there."

JAGUAR CLUB OF FLORIDA (JCOF) Concours d'Elegance JUDGE'S TRAINING EXTRAORDINAIRE

Judge's training day. The class and the practice session afterwards were conducted at the Alaqua Country Club in Longwood. The meeting facilities and the space for the practice session were excellent.


Our meeting started at 10:00AM and the class was presided over and conducted by Tom Wright, our new Chief Judge for the Jaguar Club of Florida. Thirteen (13) club members and prospective judges were in attendance.


The class involved 2 segments. The first was a discussion based on the JCNA Concours rules. This proved to be a very lively discussion followed by everyone participating in taking the JCNA test for certifying judges.


Copies of the test were distributed by Tom Wright and everyone became involved discussing the correct answer(s) to each question and why. Judge Tom was interested in getting all of us to be able research the correct

answers when they were not clear or readily known. Since the test is an open book test, the primary objective was to learn where and how to find the answers.

Eventually, the discussions became lively. When the group sort of got stuck, Tom would step in to clarify the question before defining the answer. The test involved 50 questions. With 13 intense participants involved, after a couple of hours it was pointed out that we were only on question number 12. At that rate, it would take over eight hours to complete and get through all 50 questions. Time for a refreshing lunch.







For this segment, there were 4 different types and classes of Jaguars represented. A benefit to the owners who volunteered their cars was to have so many eyes and so much more time than judges would normally take at a real Concours. After learning of potential problems there would be time to correct them before showing at the JCOF Concours in Celebration on March 19th.

Practicing judges will likely point out issues relating to vehicles of which the owners may not have been aware. In many



ways this part of the day was most interesting. Without the pressure of time (15 minutes max per car) and in a very friendly exchange of information, an overall good time was had by all. On schedule, the training class was adjourned promptly at around 3:00 PM.

Editor's Note: First timers who completed this course may now serve as apprentices at a JCNA sanctioned Concours, then become certified by JCNA. Maintaining certification requires attending an additional training class within three years. JCNA judging guidelines are quite specific and standardized across North America. 




